DO NOT SEND MONEY FOR A DOG LICENSE WITHOUT A COPY OF THE RABIES CERTIFICATE. A LICENSE WILL NOT BE ISSUED!

State law requires that all dogs must be vaccinated against rabies within 30 days after reaching the age of four months and revaccinated within a year from that date. <u>Owners must present proof that their dogs are vaccinated against rabies by a veterinarian before the dogs can be licensed.</u>

All violations shall be subject to forfeitures for each offense together with applicable penalty assessment and taxable costs of prosecution. Forfeitures range from \$35 to \$1,000.

Poll Workers and Chief Election Inspectors Needed

Nasewaupee is looking for town residents willing to serve as **Poll Workers** for future elections. In addition, the Town is also looking for two or three residents who would be willing to take additional training and serve as a **Chief Election Inspector.**

How to Serve as a Poll Worker in Nasewaupee

In Wisconsin, poll workers, also known as election inspectors, are appointed at the municipal level. Anyone who is interested in working future elections should contact Town Clerk Jill Lau – <u>nasewaupeeclerk@gmail.com</u> or phone 920-495-0920. What are the responsibilities of a poll worker? Duties can include issuing ballots to registered voters, registering voters, monitoring the voting equipment, explaining how to mark the ballot or use the voting equipment, a greeter who assists with answering questions and directing voters to the voting area, and tabulators to assist at the polling place after it closes. Hours of work? Polls open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 8:00 p.m. Poll workers can work a full day, generally from 6:30 a.m. until approximately 9:00 p.m. or later in the case of November elections. Some elections allow the Town to schedule split shifts. Are poll workers (election inspectors) paid? Poll workers are compensated for working at polling places at a rate determined by the Town Board. In addition, Poll workers are usually appointed to two-year terms and are generally asked to make a minimum two-year commitment. Chief Election Inspectors are required to attend an approximate 2-hour course before they can serve as an election official. Chief inspectors need at least six hours of approved election training every two years to maintain their certification.
